#### THE CENTENNIAL LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD



SENATOR SAM A. NUNN JR. 61L 62L

Co-Chairman and Chief Executive Officer, Nuclear Threat Initiative (NTI)

Sam Nunn is co-chairman and chief executive officer of the Nuclear Threat Initiative (NTI), a nonprofit, nonpartisan organization working to reduce the risk of use and prevent the spread of nuclear, biological and chemical weapons. He served as a US senator from Georgia for 24 years, from 1972 to 1996, and is retired from the law firm of King & Spalding.

In addition to his work with NTI, he has continued his service in the public policy arena as a distinguished professor in the Sam Nunn School of International Affairs at Georgia Institute of Technology in Atlanta and as chair emeritus of the Center for Strategic and International Studies in Washington, DC.

Nunn attended Georgia Tech, Emory University, and Emory University School of Law, where he graduated with honors in 1962. After active duty service in the US Coast Guard, he served six years in the US Coast Guard Reserve. He first entered politics as a member of the Georgia House of Representatives in 1968.

During his tenure in the US Senate, Nunn served as chairman of the Senate Armed Services Committee and the Permanent Subcommittee on Investigations. He also served on the Intelligence and Small Business Committees. His legislative achievements include the landmark Department of Defense Reorganization Act, drafted with the late Senator Barry Goldwater, and the Nunn-Lugar Cooperative Threat Reduction Program, which provided assistance for more than 20 years to Russia and the former Soviet republics for securing and destroying their excess nuclear, biological, and chemical weapons.

Nunn was born in Macon and raised in Perry, Georgia. He is married to the former Colleen O'Brien. They have two children, Michelle Nunn and Brian Nunn 92C, and three grandchildren.

## PRESIDENT BILL CLINTON

Founder, Clinton Foundation 42<sup>nd</sup> President of the United States

William Jefferson Clinton, the  $42^{nd}$  President of the United States, was also the  $42^{nd}$  Governor of Arkansas, serving six terms before being elected to two terms in the White House. Under his leadership, the country enjoyed the strongest economy in a generation and the longest peacetime economic expansion in US history, including the creation of more than 22 million jobs.

After leaving the White House, President Clinton founded the William J. Clinton Foundation with the mission to improve global health, strengthen economies, promote healthier childhoods and reduce health disparities, and protect the environment by fostering partnerships among governments, businesses, nongovernmental organizations (NGOs), and private citizens to turn good intentions into measurable results.

Today the Foundation has staff and volunteers around the world working to improve lives through several initiatives, including the Clinton Health Access Initiative, which is helping five million people living with HIV/AIDS access lifesaving drugs. The Clinton Climate Initiative, the Clinton Development Initiative, and the Clinton Giustra Enterprise Partnership are applying a business-oriented approach to fight climate change worldwide and to promote sustainable economic growth in Africa and Latin America. In the US, the Foundation is working to combat the alarming rise in childhood obesity and preventable disease through the Alliance for a Healthier Generation and the Clinton Health Matters Initiative. From 2005 through 2016, the Clinton Global Initiative brought together global leaders to devise and implement innovative solutions to some of the world's most pressing issues. CGI's nearly 3,600 Commitments to Action to date have improved the lives of more than 435 million people in 180 nations.

In addition to his Foundation work, President Clinton has joined with former President George H.W. Bush three times – after the 2004 tsunami in South Asia, Hurricane Katrina in 2005, and Hurricane Ike in 2008, and with President George W. Bush in Haiti in the aftermath of the 2010 earthquake.

President Clinton was born on August 19, 1946, in Hope, Arkansas. He and his wife Secretary Hillary Rodham Clinton have one daughter, Chelsea, and two grandchildren, Charlotte and Aidan. They live in Chappaqua, New York.
